Born March 29, 1922, Emlen Tunnell played college football before serving in the U.S. Coast Guard during WWII. He then spent ten years with the New York Giants and three years with the Green Bay Packers before retiring in 1962. After leaving the field, he went on to coach and scout for the Giants and was the first African American inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967.
